Getting there...

Glasgow is easily accessible by road, air and rail from Scotland and the north of England. The Teacher building is 20 yards from the St Enoch's Square Subway station.

By bus:

Routes 9, 16, 16A, 18 and 62 run at least every 10 minutes to the city and until 1900 from the city on most services. Stops are made on Argyle Street, which adjoins Jamaica Street, Howard Street and Osborne Street to access St Enoch Square and the Teacher Building:

On foot

From Glasgow Queen Street: Come out of the station onto George Street with George Square ahead of you. Turn right and take Queen Street down, then turn right onto Argyle Street. Take the first left down Buchanan Street to St. Enoch Square.

From Glasgow Central Station: Come out of the station onto Union Street. Walk straight down and turn left onto Argyle Street. Take the first road on the right into St Enoch Square.

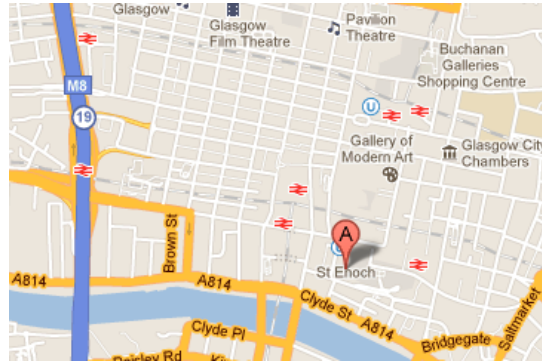
By road:

Leave the M8 at Junction 19, onto Argyle Street (A814). Follow this road until you reach Jamaica Street on your right. Turn into Jamaica Street and follow down until Howard Street is on your left. The Thistle Car Park (directly behind the Teacher building) is on the corner where these two streets meet. Discounted parking is available there for delegates (the day rate is currently £5).
